## The virtuous woman! (Mothers Day)

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[0:00] Greetings to all of you and good morning and happy Mother's Day. I've been really blessed this morning already to be here and just worshiping together.

It's about Mother's Day here right from the start.

Does anybody know where that started as a holiday or as something that a country or the world acknowledges as Mother's Day? Does anybody know the name of the lady that was behind that?

I didn't either. I looked it up. I remember Brother Manny used to tell us that at Mother's Day. And by the way, speaking of Manny, he gave an update the other day.

He has cancer in some of his organs now, so he's asking for prayer. Well, now I might have lost it.

[1:25] It doesn't really matter, does it? But I just thought it was interesting. Her name was Annie something.

And last name was Jarvis. Anna Jarvis. Anyway, it was in West Virginia, Grafton, West Virginia in 1908, that it was that she went to her mother's grave.

And she just had such a heart for mothers, I guess. And it was President Woodrow Wilson that proclaimed it a national holiday. It started in the U.S.

And then Mother's Day quickly spread worldwide into other countries. And they embraced it as a holiday as well.

So I just thought that was interesting from an earthly standpoint, how that one lady pushed for it and it finally became a national holiday.

[2:41] And here we are celebrating Mother's Day every May, right? But long before that, excuse me, might need a drink of water, somebody could get me one.

But long before that, it was mothers were celebrated. It didn't just start in 1908 or, you know, in the last century.

So I'd like to share some thoughts here, message here to the mothers mainly, young ladies and mothers. I was traveling yesterday.

Some, I told my wife, what should I preach? And I don't think she minds me saying this. But I was wanting to just have an encouraging message and just to bless the mothers and be encouraging and uplifting.

And she said, but we need to be challenged too. So often we, especially on Mother's Day, you don't really, I don't feel like challenging you about anything really, but rather just to bless you.

[3:59] And thank you. And if there are any challenges, hopefully those will bless you. So we'll look at it that way. It's not to preach down on you in any way.

But I would like to go through Proverbs 31, at least for part of the, the main part of the Scripture maybe, the verse on the board.

Favor is deceitful and beauty is vain, but a woman that feareth the Lord, she shall be praised. Give her the fruit of her hands and let her own works be praised in the gates.

So it's okay to honor the women, the mothers, on Mother's Day and every day really. But it says the fruit of her hands and let her own works be praised.

But favor is deceitful. We know what vanity can do and much favor and so on, but, and that beauty is vain.

But a woman that fears the Lord, that really caught my eye this morning. a woman that fears the Lord, she shall be praised.

You know, this whole thing is God's idea of motherhood. You know, God could have had a different plan than having mothers for people to be multiplied in the earth, but that's the route he chose and that's what he chose and I had to think this morning as we were singing, you know, he even, he even decided to come to earth.

How? Through a mother. And the angel said, and all nations will call you blessed. Motherhood to God is very important and it's a great deal to him.

In fact, what an expression. It's almost like, you know, God, he created man and he created the earth and all that's in it and then he created woman and she became a mother.

And I had to think, what an expression of God's love through mothers. a mother with a little child, you know, she cares for that little child.

[6:33] Like, you don't get between a mother and her cub in the wild. A little bit that way in the human race. But a mother is very protective of her little child and as that child grows and as, even when he or she is an adult, she still prays for that child.

Right? There is such a picture of Christ's love to humanity if you just look at mothers and how they care for their children.

The Bible says in Proverbs chapter 31 verse 10 the title is simply The Virtuous Woman.

But it says in verse 10 who can find a virtuous woman for her price is far above rubies.

Far above those precious stones and valuable you know, you might say gold or silver or rubies or you know, those but the proverb writer here, he chose rubies.

[7:48] the heart of her husband does safely trust in her so that he shall have no need of spoil.

And I want to read that in the Amplified.

It says the heart of her husband trusts in her with secure confidence and he will have no lack of gain.

And what is he saying here? I believe that the main thrust here is that she can be trusted in all areas. And that's why I mean her husband just trusts in her.

And specifically her husband can get ahead in life if he chooses to obviously. But the wife that he's trusting in, there's no hindrance of moving ahead spiritually perhaps, financially, whatever.

There's no hindrance there. Verse 12, she will do him good and not evil all the days of her life. Wow.

[8:58] And then the Amplified, she comforts and encourages and does him only good and not evil all the days of her life. I like how they added she comforts and encourages.

You know, this chapter is kind of a high standard. But let it bless you however God chooses.

Motherhood is great. It's perhaps one of the greatest honors on earth is to be a mother. And yet it's also a great challenge.

It's also a great challenge. I mean, what can I say other than just the Bible, the Word of God? She seeketh wool and flax, worketh willingly with her hands.

She's a, yeah, I just added, she's a hard worker in other words. She is like the merchant's ships. She bringeth her food from afar. You know, and I'm preaching here to the mothers, but a lot of this also would apply to the man.

[10:09] And we do preach to us men, don't we? I have one verse for us men then as well. She riseth also while it is yet night, and giveth food, meat to her, household, and a portion to her maidens.

How many times does a mother arise at night, especially when her children are young, when there's babies, when there's, right, it's just a given, and sometimes us husbands do well to take note, to bless, to be respectful, to help, not just push it all on her, but I wasn't going to preach to the husbands, but it's hard not to.

But, yeah, we know that the mother gets up many times at night, early in the morning. This is talking also about early in the morning, hard working, taking care of matters.

And it's okay to be tired. It's okay to be in need of rest, talking to the mothers here. But, according to this chapter, it's not okay to be lazy.

And to, it's not okay to not do your duties, or make sure things are taken care of. Life can be very demanding. And taking care of your home and family is a lot of work.

[11:59] That's why I think us husbands need to be sensitive and careful and helpful, however we can be. But doing these things as unto the Lord ends up in a joyful work.

You know, and sometimes there's physical problems. There's sometimes, I think of my nephew's wife that is in a wheelchair and she has young children. And there's times when a lady can't do much physical work.

And hopefully in that case she has a caring husband that will step in, and maybe even children as they grow, that will step in and help their mom.

But a capable, healthy woman has a lot of work to get done daily around her house. And if her house is to be in order, and if her husband is to trust in her.

Is that fair? I mean, that's what I believe these verses are saying, that she's diligent. And I believe you ladies here are that.

[13:09] And we appreciate that. We see that here in our church. You see the hard work and the things. You know, we have fellowship meals pretty often, and we never come worried that there's not food, or that the food isn't good, or that there's not enough, or that we're not taken care of.

It's just kind of an automatic, isn't it? So you all do these things. Verse 16, She considereth a field, and buyeth it. With the fruit of her hands, she planteth a vineyard, I love these verses, and just to go down through and just take some and break them down a little bit.

You know, I don't know what all this is, you know, what you can read into this, but I take it as this verse here, she considereth something that she's going to buy. And she's looking for a good deal.

I mean, who doesn't have a wife here, you know, that's married, of course. But what wife here doesn't watch for bargains? You know, maybe that's why ladies like thrift stores, and they like garage sales, and they, you know, us men are like, please, let's just go to Lowe's and get what we need.

But the lady, no, she's looking for that bargain. She considers the need and the value, and then she buys it for a good price. It's the difference maybe between us men and the ladies, and maybe some of you men like thrift stores, but my, I love it that my wife is one of her favorite stores, and it's amazing the kind of deal she can find.

[14:54] It's amazing. Good quality for good prices. I think that verse applies. She considers, she girdeth her loins with strength and strengthens her arms.

She perceives that her merchandise is good. Her candle goeth not out by night. Wow.

She layeth her hands to the spindle, and her hands hold the staff. She stretcheth out her hand to the poor.

Yea, she reacheth forth her hand to the needy. Now, how does she still have time for other people? How does she have time to reach her hand out to those around you, you know, outside of her family, the poor?

Those that are blessed less, or have, yeah, those that are in need. And I believe that while a wife and a mother cannot fulfill all the needs around you, it's not possible for you to fulfill all the needs that we see, that you see.

[16:13] A virtuous woman sees the needs as God shows it to her, and she simply does what she can instead of turning a blind eye to the needs. needs.

Sometimes maybe she'll tell her husband, I see a need, you know, or she has a caring heart, in other words. Isn't that amazing?

After all that a mother does, she still sees needs of others, you know, like making a meal for somebody, or, you know, that's not even part of your home.

Not even, that's amazing. It's an amazing thing, and you all do those things. She is not afraid of the snow of her household.

I'm sorry. She's not afraid of the snow for her household, for all her household are clothed with scarlet. Believe that verse is simply saying that even in the cold, there's no worry.

[17:15] She'll make sure you have something warm to wear. She maketh herself coverings of tapestry. Her clothing is silk and purple.

He sounds like an extremely busy person. Who can even live up to this standard? Her husband is known in the gates, when he sitteth among the elders of the land.

Wow. We'll keep reading here. I want to just inject that here in a little bit maybe. We're just going to open it up for some of you all to bless your mothers.

We might do that a few times here throughout the message. So be prepared to give a blessing or an encouragement. This is a lot of things.

Do we take for granted our mothers? Do we sometimes? I feel like growing up, I heard very little teaching about this, and I feel like I neglected my mom, growing up especially, until we became parents.

[18:30] I was like, wow, did my mom do all those things for me? Did I ever stop and thank her? You all have an opportunity here today to do that. for husband is known at the gates when he sitteth among the elders of the land.

There's a reason he put that verse in there. You know, depending on you, the wife, what your life is like makes a difference on how your husband is known.

she maketh fine linen and selleth it, and delivereth girdles unto the merchant. Strength and honor are her clothing, and she shall rejoice in time to come.

May you be closed with strength and honor. She openeth her mouth with wisdom, and in her tongue is the law of kindness.

She looketh well to the ways of her household, and eateth not the bread of idleness. I want to just, I don't have this in my notes, but that verse 26, where she openeth her mouth with wisdom, and in her tongue is the law of kindness.

[19:56] And I just want to encourage the mothers in this thing of teaching, teaching the younger, teaching your children.

Don't let that grow old. Brother Dan mentioned the one that rocks the cradle. But to teach, you have such an opportunity to teach.

You have a short opportunity. These little ones, these little infants don't stay little very long, do they? They grow so fast.

And then they keep growing, and then they're gone. And, you know, from your house. We have such a short time, and I believe that mothers have perhaps the greater opportunity to teach and to influence little children.

Perhaps the greatest one is the mother. Yes, we play a role in that. We obviously do. We have a huge responsibility, and that is fathers as well.

[21:09] But there's supposed to be wisdom, and let's see, what did that verse say? Wisdom with her mouth, and that in her tongue is the law of kindness.

It's amazing. To teach your children the things of God, and it can start when they're one years old, even before that.

It can start so young. It's amazing what a little two-year-old can begin to understand, and the words that come out of a two-year-old's mouth, whether it's a song, or a Bible verse, or just a phrase, or something about God that's being instilled in that little child.

God bless mothers that do that, that take the time to do that. God will honor that.

Verse 27 said that she looks well to the ways of her household, and eateth not the bread of idleness. I wanted to mention, too, that, you know, the rest of us.

[22:27] How does this apply to young ladies and young men? You know, or doesn't it? I think that you young ladies want to be like this.

You want to be a Proverbs 31 woman. As much as you can be. And I think we'll get to that a little bit later. But that last verse, she eateth not the bread of idleness, I'm not sure what the writer had in mind there totally, but I do believe that what the Bible says about a virtuous woman and what she is and what she does.

Idleness is not an option. In other words, just wasting time. Now, I want to clarify that or comment on it at least.

But, let me just finish the thought. Wasting time on social media is perhaps one of the biggest time wasters. And, I'm not exclusively saying that to you ladies.

I'm saying that to all of us. But, here's the question. Is your husband known at the gates by your works, like these verses?

[24:05] Or, is he known by the way you keep your posts and your likes? can we challenge you with that?

Oh, yeah, that's so-and-so's wife. Yeah, she posts this stuff. Or, are you known by how you keep your house and how you treat your family, how you serve your husband?

Is that how we're known? Or, is it by what we put out for others to see that is so easy to do nowadays? Back when this was written, that didn't exist. That wasn't an option.

But, anyway, those can be some real-time wasters. And, you know, we're not saying, when I say idleness, and I know that word's in here, but we're not saying that you can't be set time aside and relax and rest.

And you have to. You need to take care of yourself. We recognize that. God recognizes that. But anything that hinders you from serving your husband or for being virtuous in what we're talking about, the things that hinder, that's what we're talking about, those idle things.

[ 25:27 ] If it keeps you from doing what God's will is for you, then maybe there's some changes that need to be made. there's a favorite verse in this chapter.

Here's an encouraging one. Verse 28, her children arise up and call her blessed. Her husband also praiseth her.

We'll turn that over to us, do we? Do we praise our wives enough, our moms enough? Excuse me.

Many daughters have done virtuously, but thou excellest them all. Our children, you know, our children go through stages sometimes when they're young or, you know, young adults.

But as they grow, and I think this behooves us husbands to maybe not, maybe demand is too strong a word, but to teach our little children to respect their mom, to respect her space, her house, her kitchen, her, you know, just to show respect and to talk respectfully.

[26:57] In fact, disrespectfully should just simply not be allowed. And how, what was my thought?

Oh, as far as, what blesses me then is to see young men, especially, and also ladies, young ladies, but in the home to bless their mom.

I know my sons, all three of them bless their mom. I think quite frequently Ellie would say. And that's such a blessing. To just go and bless her for what all she's done for them.

She deserves that. You know, I don't know if demanding is too strong from a father, but I think that God is glorified in that.

Because this verse says, her children will rise up and call her blessed. Blessed. may that be a vision for those of you that have young children.

[ 28:00 ] That my children are going to bless my wife. They're going to grow up and they're going to be blessing her for all this work that she's doing for them. I want them to realize those things.

Many daughters have done virtuously, but you are above them all. Okay, verse 30. Favor and deceit and beauty is vain. But a woman that feareth the Lord, she shall be praised.

There's so much that could be said in this verse. As at least one of her key verses today. Give her of the fruit of her hands and let her own works be praised in the gates.

Proverbs 31 is a high standard. And maybe you feel kind of like how do you ever get to that?

Well, just a little bit at a time. Maybe. don't feel overwhelmed. I don't want this to be an overwhelming message, but rather an encouraging one.

[29:29] In Titus, we want to look at a few New Testament scriptures as well. In Titus 2, chapter 3, we're going to just read a few verses and then maybe look at a few words that I looked up.

And in the meanwhile, while we turn to that or whatever, who would like to share something about your mother? It says, those last verses say, that her children will rise up and call her blessed.

Who wants to just bless your mom? Like now? Merlin? Yeah, we can pass the mic. I think maybe Joe's are watching. check.

There we go. I was challenged already very much. I know I didn't respect or bless my mom as much as I should have growing up.

There was a lot of regret in that area. I just want to thank you for being my mother. I know that you cared for me and taught me a lot of things.

[30:52] Could talk about it for a long time. Thank you and appreciate you. Anyone else? We'll take a little time.

Yeah, I want my mom to be able to see me. I want to see her. Yeah, I just want to share that I'm very blessed to have you as a mother. I was just thinking this morning that my mom has taught me a lot of things, a lot of good things.

First of all, I just want to thank you for all the times that when I went to work, you always made my lunch and stuff the night before and made sure that I was taken care of. We talked a little bit about that the other night. She still does that for Justin.

I just want to bless you with that. I just never had to worry. I didn't have to ask, hey, is there going to be lunch tomorrow? I just knew there would. Also, all the clothes that have been washed, it was over 20 years she did that for me.

I just want to thank you for that. Anyway, this morning I was just thinking about something that you taught me that I appreciate the most.

[ 32:00 ] I just remember one time I was probably 10 or 12, I don't remember, somewhere in there. We were working outside in our garden. I think she was working on strawberries and I just remember I was picking rocks.

I hated that job. Anyway, I was doing that and I remember looking up and seeing my mom. Everything she does inside takes care of all the stuff in the house and she was outside working.

and I just remember seeing her stand up all beat up physically working and I just remember thinking that wow, I just was blessed with that.

This morning that memory just became very real to me and I just appreciate that. I think that's the number one thing that I'm thankful for that you taught me is good work ethic and working hard and I just appreciate that.

I just bless you for that. and I also want to bless my wife. My children are pretty young and there's a lot of things that stand out to me about my wife but the number one thing is that she does not allow circumstances to determine how she treats her children and I just really appreciate that especially when I'm maybe not lovable or if I'm having a bad day.

[33:16] She still takes care of the family and the children so I just want to bless you for that. Do one more at this time.

Who else? Tim? Tim? Yeah.

I know growing up I didn't this was this wasn't talked about and I didn't respect mom as much as I should have and yeah but I really appreciate you and all that you do for us and always make sure our lunches are packed and everything's taken care of.

Wash your clothes and yeah you just do so many things for us and so thank you. Thank you. Thank you. Thank you Tim.

There's many of you right? So that's very special. Amen. I want to look at a few verses here in Titus.

The aged women likewise that they be in behavior as becometh holiness not false accusers not given to much wine teachers of good things there's that word teachers again that they may teach the young women to be sober to love their husbands to love their children.

I'm glad they didn't Titus or yeah see who wrote this Paul wrote this to Titus I believe. He didn't put an age in there he just said the aged women the older women.

you know are you older than somebody else? I'm not sure what the age is but to be teachers and to teach the younger ones those that are younger than you to love their husbands to love their children to be discreet chaste keepers at home good obedient to their own husbands that the word of God be not blasphemed.

You know there's none of you here this morning that none of us want the word of God to be blasphemed. But according to this verse it could happen very easily.

I want to look at a few of these words. What does it mean to be discreet? And I like I always go to Noah Webster's dictionary first.

[ 36:04] But the word discreet means prudent wise in avoiding errors or evil. So you're careful to avoid errors or evil.

And in selecting the best means to accomplish a purpose circumspect cautious wary not rash. You don't just quickly do something carelessly like but no you think it through in other words.

That's what that word discreet prudent wise avoiding errors. I just looked that up I thought wow I need to be more discreet. I need to I need that word.

You know not not just I know we're preaching to the ladies but it's for all of us. Let's look at the next word chaste. What does the word chaste mean? In language pure genuine uncorrupt free from barbarous words and phrases and from quaint effected extravagant expressions.

Wow. quaint extravagant expressions but pure uncorrupt genuine and I want to talk to the young ladies for a minute.

[ 37 : 36 ] I know there's not many of you here but Mother's Day involves you even if you're not yet a mother or not even married.

But these are qualities that a godly young man is looking for and if you want a godly man for a husband someday you will want and need these qualities and if you ignore these things now it is very unlikely that a godly man will be looking for you.

It will only bring a man of similar character and caliber. Like as you so will he be unless God intervenes and blesses you with a godly husband anyway.

But I just want to encourage you that these things that we're talking about to really get a hold of that if you haven't already. I think some of you older ones that I know have.

You are godly. You are these things. But I want to encourage you that if you are not these things or if you're questioning these things that you just really put your heart to them because that will also determine the kind of man that will come looking for you.

[39:12] The kind of man that you want. Because he's looking for these virtues, right? We're looking for this. I mean us that are Christians and godly now.

If you're just a worldly young man then you won't care. You won't go for these things. And I want to share this.

Something that bothered me in the past. Maybe I'm running ahead of myself there. Well, no, I'll share this.

So, something that has bothered me in the past was when a woman or a wife of another man steps out of her place.

I'm missing a verse. Let me look here for a minute. Something got a little messed up.

- [40:22] Our printer still isn't working. So, I have to do it this way. I'm just going to read a few verses first in 1 Peter and then I'll share what I was going to share.
  - 1 Peter chapter 3 and I'll read it in the Amplified in verse 1. It says, in the same way you wives be submissive to your own husbands, subordinate not as inferior, but out of respect for the responsibilities entrusted to your husbands and their accountability to God and so partnering with them.

I'm trying to remember how the King James words it, but this gives much more detail. So that if some do not obey the word of God, that they may be won over to Christ without discussion by the godly lives of their wives.

Verse 2, when they see your modest and respectful behavior, together with your devotion and appreciation, love your husband, encourage him, and enjoy him as a blessing from God.

Your adornment must not be merely external with interweaving and elaborate knotting of the hair, I think the King James says, braided maybe, and wearing of gold jewelry, or being superficially preoccupied with dressing in expensive clothes, but let it be the inner beauty of the hidden person of the heart, with the imperishable quality and unfading charm of a gentle and peaceful spirit.

[42:15] King James says a quiet spirit, a meek and quiet spirit, one that is calm and self-controlled, not overanxious, but serenely and spiritually mature, which is very precious in the sight of God.

For in this way, in former times, the holy women who hoped in God, all used to adorn themselves, being submissive to their own husbands and adapting themselves to them.

And it goes on to say how Sarah obeyed Abraham and called him Lord and so on. And then it says that you, if you want to be the daughters of Abraham and so on.

And what I wanted to share is just this thing of, you know, it's not wrong to talk to other people, other couples especially, or even men in certain situations, but a number of years ago, a lady right in front of her husband wanted to meet us.

She was telling me, I believe, how she believes, knowing that I agree with her, knowing that, and it was a doctrinal issue, that her and her husband were in disagreement.

[ 43:46 ] It had to do with baptism. And it was really awkward because, yeah, I agree with her, but I probably, if I'd have had time to think a little more, I'd have probably responded different too.

But anyway, I think that's what these verses are saying, or at least this one verse about, you know, even if they didn't quite see it the same, you know, don't use another man to prove your point to your husband.

That's what was going on, which I felt was very disrespectful. And it definitely didn't help their marriage. Okay.

Now, there are times, and I have it here somewhere, there are times when it's difficult, and it becomes complicated.

We recognize that. When a husband is not walking in the fear of God, or he's not being obedient to God, and here we are saying, the woman obeyed the husband, and that becomes complicated.

[45:02] But I believe that you respect and honor him, where you can, and even if he doesn't deserve it. I believe God will reward a woman like that.

So I read this in Peter, and then we'll go to, yes, that one statement there in verse 4 where it says about the hidden woman, or the hidden person of the heart.

It's imperishable. I like that. Imperishable. These other outward things perish, and often they're vain.

But that quality that is gentle, it's peaceful, is very precious in the sight of God. Don't ever underestimate that preciousness, and that example.

people. I see what's happened here in this screen is there's duplicates.

[ 46:14 ] All of a sudden, there's another paragraph, so just bear with me as I read through here a little bit. Sometimes our thoughts are that way, but we don't expect our computers to be that way.

One verse to the husbands here in verse 7. We were done there in Peter with what was said to the ladies, but now I added one verse just to kind of get back at the husbands a little bit.

In the same way you husbands live with your wives in an understanding way, and great gentleness and tact, and with an intelligent regard for the marriage relationship as with someone physically weaker since she is a woman.

I believe King James says, as a weaker vessel, but it's talking about, I believe too, about physically. Show her honor and respect as a fellow heir of the grace of life so that your prayers will not be hindered or ineffective.

And the fear of the Lord. One of the things I want to end with is just the importance in all of this, in all of these things, to have a relationship with Jesus and to know Jesus personally and to walk with Him, to know His heart and to know His desire for you as a wife, as a mother.

[48:04] life can be very hard and is sometimes often unfair in this life. But knowing Jesus and having a personal relationship with Him is the answer to get you through.

In fact, through anything that you face. Life brings so many changes and sometimes even deep heartache and discouragement.

Loss. There's so many things that are difficult. But when we fear the Lord and we trust Him, where all your trust is on Him, knowing His righteousness, His holiness, and to know His grace, to have His grace upon your life, will give you the strength that you need.

being a mother is one of the highest callings on earth. And to fulfill this calling.

to fulfill this calling in the Lord requires so much strength.

[49:48] And you need more strength than what you can come up with yourself. As Paul said, I can do all things through Christ who strengthens me.

He is my helper in time of need. My strength when I am weak. Do you as a Christian cry out to Him?

As one that knows your Lord and your Savior, cry out to Him when things become difficult in relationships or whatever it is, physical.

In other words, we just need Jesus to know Him. These things are not possible without Him.

this virtue is not possible without Him. It's just good sounding stuff, but it won't happen without Christ as your Lord.

[51:09] We cry out for Him for strength, for courage, for comfort, for anything you need. It's all through Him and it's all for Him. Remember that.

It's through Him and it's for Him. It is to bring glory to God.

And I think that's why motherhood is being so oppressed and mocked by the world. True, godly motherhood is actually mocked by our world.

The world never wants to bring glory to God. The enemy, the devil, never wants to see glory go to God. And so what does he do?

He tries to destroy the whole thought of motherhood and make women something they were never created to be. That's not in my notes, but isn't that how it is?

[52:14] to make women just a career person. And marriage is just optional.

Motherhood is meh, kind of like that. That's the world. God calls it precious. is. It's very dear to his heart.
